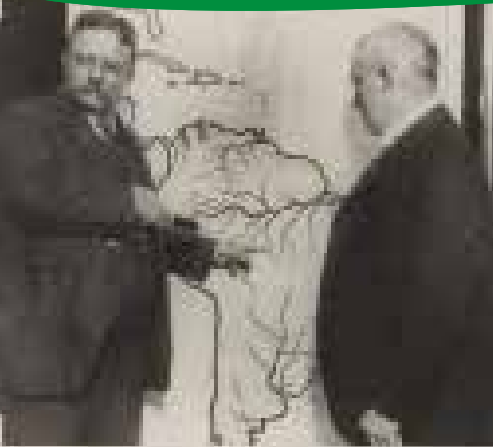
January 5 - *Snowmobile Challenge*

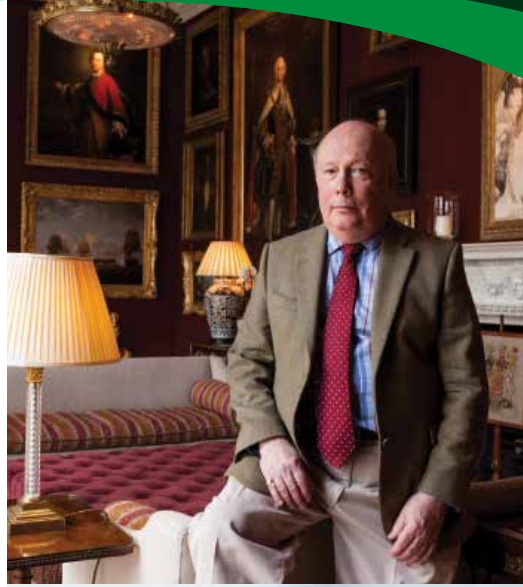

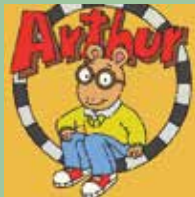
